Dear Families,

Each month, students will have an opportunity to learn about and apply character traits. These traits will be discussed in our classrooms, specialist classrooms, and even on the playground!

Our trait for October is PERSISTENCE - *Sticking with something even when it is challenging.* Having persistence means you try and try again even when it feels hard.

We have been reading books and sharing stories about persistence from real life. PTA bought us some huge dice with fun prompts to help us tell stories of persistence and role play! Student leaders from Woodinville High School will also be visiting us to share their stories of persistence.

October is also bullying prevention month. At East Ridge, our students are learning how to use empathy and persistence to become "upstanders" instead of "bystanders." A bystander is someone who sees bullying happening but doesn't know what to do. An upstander is someone who stops bullying by being a buddy, interrupting, speaking out, and telling an adult. Ask your child what he/she has learned about being an upstander!

Here are a few ideas for helping your child with persistence at home:

- Encourage and praise persistence at home when you see your child really sticking to something!
- Tell your own stories of persistence from your life, from the lives of your family members, and/or from people that you look up to.
- Watch out what you say about yourself! As parents, if we say things like, "I am terrible at math," or "I am just not a good speller," it shows a fixed mindset rather than an attitude that you can learn and grow and get better!
- Ask your child how they are showing persistence at school and at home

Our students are getting so good at recognizing and appreciating persistence! Many students are complimenting their peers and their teachers when they see them using persistence!

East Ridge Elementary Veterans Day Assembly Thursday, November 9, 2017 2:20 pm – Gym


