

FREE AND REDUCED-PRICE BREAKFAST AND LUNCH

Parents whose income falls within guidelines set by the U.S. Department of Agriculture should apply for free or reduced-price meals. All students who qualify for reduced meals can receive a breakfast at no charge. Students K-3 who qualify for reduced meals will also be served lunch at no charge. Applications are available after August 1st. You can apply online or download an application at <u>www.nsd.org/meals</u>. You can also pick up a paper applications all school offices or the district's Food Services Office. To have an application mailed to you, call the Food Services Office at 425.408.7657.

PAY FOR SCHOOL MEALS

Parents can pay by cash or check (made out to Northshore School District) at the school. Parents may also pay online with a VISA (credit/debit), Master Card or Discover card using a secure internet site call PayPAMS. To set up an online payment account, visit **Error! Hyperlink reference not valid.**There is a \$1.95 charge for each payment transaction. There is no fee for paying with cash or check.

CHANGES TO LOW BALANCE NOTIFICATIONS

Starting with the 2017-18 school year Food Services will no longer be able to make the weekly meal balance phone calls or send out meal balance emails. For those that are registered with PayPAMS, you will continue to receive low balance reminders via email. You can also receive low balance reminders with the Northshore School District Mobile App and logging into ParentVue.

TRACK MEAL BALANCES

You can view your student's balance with the Northshore School District Mobile App. The mobile app is free and available in the App Store or Google Play (iOS or Android only) by searching for "Northshore School District". The district's Mobile App webpage at <u>www.nsd.org/mobileapp</u> provides more information about this feature and offers step-by-step login instructions. You can also view your student's meal account balance, at no charge, with PayPAMS by going online or with the Mobile App at <u>www.PayPAMS.com</u>.
